#### A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dearest friends.

I write to you about a week before the unfolding of election day with the expectation that most of you will be seeing this writing sometime around the "eve" of what many are expecting to be quite a tumultuous couple days. I've been praying about our nation, our politics and leadership both local and national, as well as how the balkanization of our body politic has had an ever increasing impact on how church lives out being the "body of Christ" in a time and culture when seemingly fewer will tolerate the intellectual diversity that our politics represent.

So what is the word to the church in the midst of this all. In truth I actually think the word is quite simple and telling at least in the proclamation... perhaps less so simple in the trusting and believing and yet isn't this often the case with "faith?"

God is the sovereign of this time and this place as He has been, and will be to the end of time itself. This world is God's good creation in its origin and in God's ongoing providence. Our politics cannot change this most foundational fact. What this reminds us to trust is that God has been active and pouring out his grace and provision in the midst of the heights of human history and in the depths of human atrocity. Who "wins' the White House will not and cannot change God's position as ruler of creation and that includes our United States... so be at peace.

The body of Christ is a union not to be torn asunder, nor separated by "hands" and "eyes" sewing contempt

upon one another as though the "other" members of the body are unnecessary or "beneath" another. This is not so in our culture... in fact almost the exact opposite tends to be the "talking points" of the day... but "talking points" and "normative cultural habits" are not permitted

us by Christ our Lord.

Jesus explicitly teaches his disciples that they are not to seek "lordship" over one another as do the "gentiles" and the apostle Paul carries this ideal into his metaphor of the body being made up all it's various parts, each one vital and each one crucial to it's wholeness and health. CNN and FOX, DNC and RNC make money off of the discord and discontent... it is not to be so among us.

You are named "child of God" in your baptism and that name carries more weight and significance than whatever name labels political affiliation. Being "child of God / Christian" is our calling to embody love, mercy and compassion or perhaps most accurately "the character of Christ Jesus our Lord" in the midst of a world that is actively hostile to God and will ultimately despise Christ until converted BY the working of the Holy Spirit.

When we vote it is in light of this higher calling to bear the image of God Himself into the world seeking to conform our will to the Will of God as best we can discern it. As we engage with our neighbors, family, and even political rivals we are called to do so embodying Christ Jesus and taking "HOW" we engage these from Him. So let us also seek to be faithful and abounding in steadfast love even with those with whom we adamantly disagree for the love of Christ shows us that love comes with suffering... unless we choose willingly to forget the cross itself.

Elections have become expressions of our cultural idolatry even to increasing degrees within the church as well. Idolatry is an insidious thing and to the degree you find yourself either "jubilating" or "despairing" who is winning or losing, serves as reasonable indicator to the power of this particular idolatry in any of our lives. Yet God says... "You shall have no other God's before me." So let's not... plain as that.

I don't share any of this claiming it's always just simple. In fact being faithful in this fallen world is often anything but simple. But God's Word is plain and doesn't really equivocate here. I think for most of us the question is often then going to fall into the realm of "Lord I hear you... will I trust you?" or to use specifically Biblical language here... "Lord, I believe. Help my unbelief." Over the next several weeks friends... let us trust and believe... and may God help our unbelief.

Peace friends and let us all lean heavily into our faithful God who is even now at work in our world!

#### LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF FALL INGATHERING



Fifty-four quilts were blessed on October 20 in preparation for the 2024 Fall LWR Ingathering. Nine boxes were packed and delivered to Redeemer's Lutheran in Seattle to be included in the ingathering shipment.

#### LWR QUILTS & KITS

Lutheran World Relief and the Quilt and Kit Ministries both began in 1945. Last year 551,700 quilts and kits were shipped to 14 different countries. This is the first year that LWR has partnered with groups within the US. This expanding outreach is possible because of generous congregations like ours.

Christian Response puts together Personal Care Kits and School Kits in alternating years. Watch for your opportunity to contribute for Personal Care Kits this spring.

WC Quilters, a group of 8 members and 1 friend, meet 4 times a month. You may sew and contribute without coming to a Sunday or Thursday sew day, but it's fun to be together. This year we are donating 54 quilts to LWR and 1 to the Auction. Your generosity allows us to purchase batting and ship quilts to the warehouse in Baltimore in Maryland. The fabrics are all donated. Many times we have no idea by whom. As a group in lowa decided, "It drops from heaven. God provides." Quilters say a big thank you for your support.



For any who would join us in sharing God's warmth and love with the world—You don't have to know how to sew or own a machine—we've got you covered, AND Betty loves helping others learn new skills.

### YOUR AUCTION AND GARAGE SALE DONATIONS AT WORK

Over the past few months, with input from our Christian Connection, and Christian Response Committees, the Church Council authorized significant donations to local community outreach programs.

Habitat for Humanity of Snohomish County was gifted \$10,000 for its Bayside Home Project. Acres of Diamonds received \$5,980 to support its Children's Program. These funds were matched dollar-for-dollar by an anonymous donor, in essence doubling our donation.

Lutheran World Relief's Gifts of Love received \$4,060, for an Irrigation System which provides water for community fields; five Eye Surgeries; and two 13-animal Herds of Hope.

The Foss Home and the Maltby Food Bank each

received a contribution of \$1,980. The Boy Scouts received \$1,800 to support their activities and a Summer Camp Scholarship.

Council also approved a \$2,500 donation to the Woodinville Storehouse Foodbank. This foodbank serves residents of Woodinville and provides nourishment and ministry to those in need.

A \$1,500 donation to United Churches Emergency Fund (UCEF) was also authorized. The UCEF provides information, referrals and small, one-time financial assistance to the homeless population in the area.

Your Church Council, with the input and guidance of our committees, looks forward to continuing to disperse the funds that the congregation has worked so hard to raise.

What do you do when God's timing seems questionable, His lack of intervention hurtful, and His promises doubtful? Life



often looks so very different than we hoped or expected. Some events may simply catch us off guard for a moment, but others shatter us completely. We feel disappointed and disillusioned, and we quietly start to wonder about the reality of God's goodness.

In It's Not Supposed to Be This Way, Lysa invites us into her own journey of faith and, with grit, vulnerability, and honest humor, helps us to: discover how to better process unmet expectations and other painful situations; stand strong and persevere through unsettling relationships and uncertain outcomes; be steadfast when God actually does give us more than we can handle; remind us of the biblical assurance that God is protecting and preparing us.
