12:27-31 as translated into Hawaiian Pidgin and recorded in a Bible Translation given to me a long time ago by some dear friends... (Da Jesus Book... A WORD Hawaiian Pidgin New Testament, Wycliff FROM THE Publishers c.2000)

Numba 1 Fo Da Corint Peopo 12: 27-31a

"Same ting wit you guys. You jalike Christ's body. Everybody jalike one part inside Christ's body. From all da peopo dat come togedda fo church, da numba one importan ting, God send some guys all ova da place fo tell wat he wen say. Numba two, he make some peopo his talka guys. Numba three, he make some peopo teachas. Den, he give some peopo da power fo do all kine awesome stuff dat show God's power. Odda peopo can make da sick peopo come good. Odda peopo can help. Odda peopo can put tings togedda strait. An odda peopo, he give um da power so dey can talk differen kine languages.

Now, wat you guys tink? God send everydody all ova da place fo tell wat he wen say? Nah. He make everybody talk fo him? Nah. He make everybody teacha guys? Nah. He make everybody do awesome kine stuff? Nah. He give everybody da power fo make da sick peopo come good? Nah. He make everybody so dey can talk differen kine languages? Nah. He make everybody so dey can tell wat da differen kine language mean? Nah.

Others will continue to quietly mow lawns and dust fixtures, while others will keep meals rolling to those hungry, while yet others will keep sewing machines buzzing to create warmth.

As a small church it is easy to think of all we "cannot do," but today I'd ask you to remember all that you ARE equipped and gifted by God to live within as a servant and friend of Jesus. Remember, give thanks, take heart and then go as Jesus sends you... wherever he leads you, however you are particularly gifted. Share Jesus' gospel however you are able in whatever ways God has given you the gifts to do so!

My encouragement in all this is quite simply summed up in this final line of this reading. Each of you go "all out" in your particular calling and in this way we, together as Christ's one body, "can handle da mos importan stuff God give you."

Abandon any pretense or judgment over others in answering God's call in ways other than yours as this is actually God's plan and intention seen through the way he chooses to give each of "da peopo" different gifts and in different measure.

Abandon too the guilt or shame applied by others of Christ's body who look with disdain upon your faith in action for not taking up their cause or advancing their particular flag. God is not done working upon their heart and their ability to do what Jesus forbids his disciples in "Lording over others." In this the fault is theirs, not yours when you are living out of the gifts God gives you.

As a church I suspect we ask ourselves questions of "how will we grow?" I find in this scripture some insight into this question—We grow as God's kingdom is served and expands. The one "follows" the other, and needfully so.

Paul reminds us in this selfsame letter that these gifts are ALL given to the building up of the body of the Christ, the church gathered BY him IN his name. Use your gifts even as we together use our distinct gifts to proclaim, heal, share, teach, speak for God and all the rest, and we will be living faithfully.

Will we "numerically" grow?... I'm not sure I find that promised here... what I do see though is that in living purposeful expressions of the unique gifts God gives to each... "you guys can handle do mos importan stuff God give you."

Now, you guys go all out so you guys can handle da mos importan stuff God give you.

Amen?

And may the peace of Christ Jesus be with you all and fill you with courage, hope and a calling to love and serve in this world!

Lutheran Disaster Response strives to help the church continue to be church in the midst of disaster — following Christ's call to bring hope and healing to our neighbor in need.

The news out of Afghanistan is unfolding tragically. Please consider a donation to Lutheran Immigrant and Refugee Services, our ELCA support group whose mission it is to address The world is especially such needs. troubled right now with many calls for action and donations. Another critical place is for Haiti - Lutheran World Relief (the same agency where WC donates quilts and personal care kits.) And of course there are needs here at home, **ELCA Disaster Response** helps with natural disasters that have hit areas impacted by wildfires and floods in the U.S.

"GOD'S WORK. OUR HANDS." SUNDAY

"God's work. Our hands." Sunday on September 12 is an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) — one church, freed in Christ to love and serve our neighbor.

Throughout the ELCA we are witnessing the love and concern God's people have for one another. During this time, congregations continue to support ministries that assist vulnerable people in their communities. These acts of service allow us to explore one of our most basic Lutheran convictions: On "God's work. Our hands." Sunday we come together to restore and reconcile our communities. You do this kind of work every day—loving your neighbors and making your community a better place.

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE

Each year the International Day of Peace is observed around the world on 21 September. The UN General Assembly has declared this as a day devoted to strengthening the ideals of peace, through observing 24 hours of non-violence and cease-fire.

In 2021, as we heal from the COVID-19 pandemic, we are inspired to think creatively and collectively about how to help everyone recover



better, how to build resilience, and how to transform our world into one that is more equal, more just, equitable, inclusive, sustainable, and healthier.

The pandemic is known for hitting the underprivileged and marginalized groups the hardest. People caught in conflict are especially vulnerable in terms of lack of access to healthcare. In line with the Secretary-General's appeal for a global ceasefire last March, in February 2021 the Security Council unanimously passed a resolution calling for Member States to support a "sustained humanitarian pause" to local conflicts. The global ceasefire must continue to be honored, to ensure people caught in conflict have access to lifesaving vaccinations and treatments.

The 2021 theme for the International Day of Peace is "Recovering Better for an Equitable and Sustainable World". We invite you to join the efforts of the United Nations family as we focus on recovering better for a more equitable and peaceful world.
