"Grace, mercy, and peace in Jesus Christ, our Lord, from Martin Luther... The deplorable conditions which I recently encountered when I was a visitor constrained me to prepare this brief and simple catechism or statement of Christian teaching. Good God, what

wretchedness I beheld! The common people, especially who live in the country, have no knowledge whatever of Christian teaching, and unfortunately many pastors are quite incompetent and unfitted for teaching. Although the people are supposed to be Christian, are baptized, and receive the holy sacrament, they do not know the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, or the Ten Commandments, they live as if they are pigs and irrational beasts, and now that the Gospel has been restored they have mastered the fine art of abusing liberty."

~ Preface to Luther's Small Catechism 1529


Dearest friends and people of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Grace and peace to you each one. So I guess the question I am asking is "How are we doing here?" How are we in each one able to share the content of our faith? How easily could you share all 10 of the 10 Commandments? Do we know the prayer Jesus gifted to us by heart or do we need it printed out in front of us to trust that the words flow simply and fluidly from our hearts and minds? When we make our confession of faith, how often have we given deepest reflection on not only what is being said, but why it is being said? As pastor, I in truth notice the indictment on pastor's being "unfit" and "incompetent" and often find myself praying for God's Holy Spirit to guide and protect me from these

very realities. I even find myself wondering how much further down the road to Hell we're strutting as a culture in our mastery of "the fine art of abusing liberty..." and in truth sadly I suspect those German's of 500 years ago have got nothing on us modern types.

So yeah.. how are we doing here?

Luther when he noted this reality took it as his occasion to write in 1529 a Small Catechism as a way to get the holy Word of God into every home and into every life he could reach. This is a tool yet available to us today. Most all of you (if you've bumped around Lutheran churches for long) likely have one of these

For many the honest answer would be "oh about the time I finished up confirmation classes." Do you know how often I would encourage you to do so?

Daily... Twice! ...

Once as you first awaken... Once before you drop off to sleep.

(Oh and by the way... M.L. wrote strongly that it should be this PLUS before and after EVERY MEAL!... he may not be wrong here but it's good to crawl before we can walk...)

I'd encourage you to:

- make the sign of the cross
- recite all 10 Commandments (this moves us to know God's will for us and for creation)
- pray as Jesus teaches us (in the Lord's Prayer, be with God using the words of Jesus)
- confess your faith with the Creed (the Word of God leads us to confess what is true)

REFORMATION SUNDAY

Reformation Day is October 31 and commemorates the Reformation movement started by Martin Luther in the 16th century. This year it is observed the Sunday before on October 29.



Reformation Sunday is a day when we remember and re-tell the family stories of our faith. Stories about men and women who came before us and taught us about the faith. Stories about people who risked everything so that we would be able to gather and worship in the manner that we do.

Throughout the year we listen to the Sunday message—about how we live our daily lives, the choices we make, the habits of our faith. On Reformation Sunday we return to the core of our faith: God loved us first, and God continues to shower us with grace and mercy.

We are called to remember that all that we are is a gift from God. Reformation Sunday is a reminder that the bedrock of our faith is the grace and mercy given to us in Jesus Christ.

YOUR AUCTION AND GARAGE SALE DONATIONS AT WORK

Over the past few months, with input from our Christian Connection, and Christian Response Committees, the Church Council authorized significant donations to local community outreach programs.

Habitat for Humanity of Snohomish County was gifted \$10,000 for its Bayside Home Project. Acres of Diamonds received \$5,980 to support its Children's Program. These funds were matched dollar-for-dollar by an anonymous donor, in essence doubling our donation.

Lutheran World Relief's Gifts of Love received \$4,060, for an Irrigation System which provides water for community fields; five Eye Surgeries; and two 13-animal Herds of Hope.

The Foss Home and the Maltby Food Bank each

received a contribution of \$1,980. The Boy Scouts received \$1,800 to support their activities and a Summer Camp Scholarship.

Council also approved a \$2,500 donation to the Woodinville Storehouse Foodbank. This foodbank serves residents of Woodinville and provides nourishment and ministry to those in need.

A \$1,500 donation to United Churches Emergency Fund (UCEF) was also authorized. The UCEF provides information, referrals and small, one-time financial assistance to the homeless population in the area.

Your Church Council, with the input and guidance of our committees, looks forward to continuing to disperse the funds that the congregation has worked so hard to raise.
